Religion

Unit 1: Growing as God Wants: Human Sexuality

This unit explores the ways that young people grow and develop physically, emotionally, intellectually, spiritually and socially, during adolescence.

Students will learn:

- People grow and develop as unique individuals.
- Jesus showed his followers how to express the love and goodness of God.
- Jesus teaches people to live God's Law.

Unit 2: Advent Christmas

This unit explores how the Bible reveals God's relationship with people and that during Advent Christians prepare for the coming of the Messiah. Students will learn:

- People ask questions to understand life.
- The Bible reveals God's relationship with people.
- During Advent Christians prepare for the coming of the Messiah.

English

- Participate in and contribute to discussions, clarifying and interrogating ideas, developing and supporting arguments, sharing and evaluating information, experiences and opinions.
- Identify and explain how analytical images like figures, tables, diagrams, maps and graphs contribute to our understanding of verbal information in factual and persuasive texts.
- Plan, draft and publish imaginative, informative and persuasive texts, choosing and experimenting with text structures, language features, images and digital resources appropriate to purpose and audience.

- Make connections between students' own experiences and those of characters and events represented in texts drawn from different historical, social and cultural contexts.
- Plan, rehearse and deliver presentations, selecting and sequencing appropriate content and multimodal elements for defined audiences and purposes, making appropriate choices for modality and emphasis.
- Understand that different social and geographical dialects or accents are used in Australia in addition to Standard Australian English.

Maths

- Compare fractions with related denominators and locate and represent them on a number line.
- Solve problems involving addition and subtraction of fractions with the same or related denominators.
- Multiply and divide decimals by powers of 10
- Explore the use of brackets and order of operations to write number sentences

- Connect decimal representations to the metric system
- Convert between common metric units of length, mass and capacity
- Interpret and compare a range of data displays, including side-by-side column graphs for two categorical variables.
- Interpret secondary data presented in digital media and elsewhere.

HASS (History)

 Stories of groups of people who migrated to Australia (including from one Asian country), the reasons they migrated (e.g. push–pull factors) and their contributions to society.

(Civics and Citizenship)

- Who can be an Australian citizen, the formal rights and responsibilities, and shared values of Australian citizenship
- The roles and responsibilities of the three levels of government, including the shared roles and responsibilities within Australia's federal system

Design & Technologies

- Principles of food preparation for healthy eating.
- Characteristics, properties and safe practice of a range of materials, systems, tools and equipment; and evaluate the suitability of their use.
- Past performance, and current and future needs are considered when designing sustainable food and fibre systems for products.

Science Mrs Bianca Craine (Monday) Biology

This term in Biological Science, the Year 6 students will be planning and conducting investigations of the conditions that affect the growth of yeast and mould. Students will devise testable questions using dependent and independent variables.

Italian Sinor Fernando Desiati (*Tuesday*)

In Italian this term, the students will explore:

- Be able to exchange positive and negative information about their daily life (sport, music, videogames, food and friends)
- Times of the day, days of the week and months of the year
- How to conjugate Italian verbs
- Use of adverbs, articles and adjectives with singular and plural nouns Pronunciation and intonation of Italian-specific sounds and writing conventions
- About Grandparents Day (Festa dei Nonni) and Christmas (Natale)

Physical Education Ms Margaret McLinden (Wednesday)

Fundamental movement skills demonstrating adjustment of force and speed to improve accuracy and control:

- Underarm/overarm throw
- Forehand strike
- Catch

Locomotor skills:

Sprinting

- Jumping
- Hopping

Maintaining a balanced position when performing a skill e.g. striking

Interpersonal skills:

- Encouraging others
- Dealing with conflicts and disagreements
- Responsibilities of different roles: 1 3 bases;
 backstop, outfielder and referee.

Visual Arts Mrs Caterina D'Angelo (Thursday)

In Visual Arts this term the children will;

- Explore artwork from various artists and identify and describe using visual arts elements.
- Share their personal responses and feelings about artwork they view and make.
- Develop their artistic skills through experimentation with shape (exaggerated proportions; motifs; fonts) and texture (real and stimulated)

Through the Art Elements of Shape and Texture children will;

- Recognise shapes that include 3D: hexagons, octagons, pentagons.
- Recognise shapes can be repeated to explore pattern, contrast, movement and emphasis.
- o Identify 3D shapes: spheres, cubes and cones, cylinders and pyramids. The shapes can be solid, linear, open or closed. The shapes can be distorted or exaggerated for special effects.
- Understand backgrounds can be developed using different textures meeting such as; sky and water; grass and bricks.

Music Mrs Jacqueline Carroll (Thursday)

Listening and Responding

Students focus on Arts Ideas and Performance. They learn to recognise the elements of music that contribute to a successful Advertising Jingle.

Students continue to develop music literacy skills through body percussion activities.
